"I saw someone completely covered in blood...Monitor us and ask us if we are okay"

"just make my mum happy I want to make her life better"

"We found a knife"

"We don't know who is staying or going"

"I feel like a stranger now on an estate I have lived my whole life"

"I don't want to live here anymore"

People are moving with no support or help. (parent)

"I don't care about what job I just want to get any job and not get into trouble"

"taxes and rent worry me"

"I feel scared"

WHAT PROFESSIONALS HAD NOTICED...

Food Poverty / holiday hunger

Emotional wellbeing / resilience concerns

Lack of trust – within the community and in services

Early years development concerns

Vulnerable to gang activity and getting drawn into youth violence

Lack of spaces for YP to engage in activities on the estate

Biggest worry is staying out of trouble and passing tests exams

YP having caring responsibilities for younger siblings as young as 3yrs during school holidays

Concerns about layout - street light / access to scooters

YP need support to raise aspirations


Drug dealing impacting feeling of safety
